Honors Book Report Guidelines:

Use this reference sheet while you are reading your selected book so that you can keep notes and create a presentation. Keep track of the time so that you aren't rushing at the last minute!

These are the necessary slides. If you want to include additional slides, you may include them anywhere within the presentation, but these slides should remain in this order.

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Slide 1	Cover page. Include: Book Title, your name, class period, date.	
Slide 2	About the book/author. Tell about the author and the time period in which it was written. Explain the zeitgeist of the time period. How does that influence the content of this story? Also tell the genre of the book and the point of view of the narration.	
Slide 3	Exposition. Tell about the setting and main characters of the book. Include a quote to support the author's characterization of the protagonist Include a quote to support the author's mood regarding the setting	
Slide 4	Conflict. Tell about what sort of conflict(s) the protagonist is facing. Include a quote to support the conflict.	
Slide 5	Brief summary of at least three events leading to the climax.	
Slide 6	Climax. Tell about the turning point in the story. Include a quote to support the climax.	
Slide 7	Falling Action/Denouement. Tell about the type of ending and what events led to it.	
Slide 8	Motifs and Symbols. What are important symbols or motifs that recur and what do they mean? How do they support themes?	
Slide 9	Themes. Discuss what you think are three major themes in the story. Include a quote to support each theme	
Slide 10	Your analysis. Give us an idea of what you liked and disliked about the story. Did you relate to any of the themes? Tell us why you thought the story was a good/bad representation of the themes being conveyed.	
Slide 11	Bibliography. Include any resources, including the book, that you may have referenced for this presentation.
